1 INTRODUCTION AND INTERPRETATION

1.1 Introduction

These Program Regulations apply to all students enrolled in the Master of Arts - Theological Studies (Coursework) Award at The University of Notre Dame Australia.

These Regulations should be read in conjunction with the University's General Regulations and the School of Philosophy and Theology Regulations.

1.2 Interpretation

The terms included in these Regulations have the meanings as defined in the University's General Regulations and the School of Philosophy and Theology Regulations.

1.3 Amendments made to Program Regulations

Unless otherwise specified, when amendments are made to the structure, content or academic requirements of this Award, the amendments will automatically apply in accordance with General Regulation Section 1.7.

1.4 Applicability to Campuses of the University

This Award is available on the Fremantle and Sydney Campuses only.

1.5 The Australian Qualifications Framework (AQF)

The Master of Arts - Theological Studies (Coursework) Award is not an AQF qualification.

2 ENTRY CRITERIA

2.1 General Criteria

The standard entry requirements for admission are detailed in the University's General Regulations and the School of Philosophy and Theology Regulations.

2.2 Additional Entry Requirements / Pre-Requisites

The following entry requirements apply to this Award:

Applicants are required to have completed a Bachelor of Theology (or equivalent) or an undergraduate degree in another discipline

2.3 External Accreditation Requirements

External accreditation requirements are not applicable to this Award.

3 AWARD REQUIREMENTS

3.1 Structure

3.1.1 Compulsory Courses

There are four (4) Compulsory courses:

THEO6010 Scripture and Church (Core Course)

THEO6400 Christology

THEO6440 Mystery of Christ: Church and Sacrament

THEO6350 Foundations of Moral Theology

3.1.2 Elective Courses

Three (3) of these courses must be taken at the 6000 level. One course may be taken from related disciplines of Religious Education, Educational Leadership, Justice Studies or Philosophy. The other three (3) are to be taken from Theology.

3.1.5 Specialisations

There are no Specialisations permitted in this Award.

3.1.6 Special Interest Courses
