## 1.5 The Australian Qualifications Framework (AQF)

The Graduate Diploma of Theology Award is a Level 8 AQF qualification.

## **2 ENTRY CRITERIA**

### **2.1 General Criteria**

Where a student has satisfied all the requirements of the Graduate Diploma of Theology Award as detailed in these Program Regulations and the General Regulations, the University may grant the student graduation status.
