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1 INTRODUCTION AND INTERPRETATION

1.1 Introduction

The Master of Arts - Theological Studies (Coursework and Dissertation) Award is not an AQF qualification.

2 ENTRY CRITERIA

2.1 General Criteria

2.2 Additional Entry Requirements / Pre-Requisites

Applicants are required to have completed a Bachelor of Theology (or equivalent) or an undergraduate degree in another discipline.

THEO6350 Foundations of Moral Theology	(25 Units of Credit)
