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1 INTRODUCTION AND INTERPRETATION

1.1 Introduction

The maximum period of time within which a student is permitted to complete the Master of Theology (Coursework and Dissertation) Award is 5 years (including any periods of approved leave of absence) from the date on which they were first accepted into the program by the University.

3.7 Graduation

Where a student has satisfied all the requirements of the Master of Theology (Coursework and Dissertation) Award as detailed in these Program Regulations and the General Regulations, the University may grant the student graduation status.
