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1 INTRODUCTION AND INTERPRETATION

1.1 Introduction

These Program Regulations apply to all students enrolled in the Gradual Certificate in Mental Health Nursing and Allied Health Award at The University of Notre Dame Australia.

These Regulations should be read in conjunction with the University's General Regulations and the School of Nursing & Midwifery Regulations.

1.2 Interpretation

The terms included in these Regulations have the meanings as defined in the University's General Regulations and the School of Nursing & Midwifery, Regulations.

1.3 Amendments made to Program Regulations

Unless otherwise specified, when amendments are made to the structure, content or academic requirements of the Graduate Certificate in Acute Mental Health Award, the amendments will automatically apply in accordance with General Regulation Section 1.7.

1.4 Applicability to Campuses of the University

The Graduate Certificate in Mental Health Nursing and Allied Health Award is available on the Fremantle Campus only.

1.5 The Australian Qualifications Framework (AQF)

The Graduate Certificate in Mental Health Nursing and Allied Health Award is a Level 8 AQF qualification.

2 ENTRY CRITERIA

2.1 General Criteria

The standard entry requirements for admission are detailed in the University's General Regulations and the School of Nursing and Midwifery Regulations.

2.2 Additional Entry Requirements / Pre-Requisites

The following entry requirements apply to this Award:

- Current license to practice as a registered nurse, or practitioner with an Australian regulatory authority, or full membership of an appropriate Australian or Professional organization.

2.3 External Accreditation Requirements

External accreditation requirements are not applicable to this Award.

3 AWARD REQUIREMENTS

3.1 Structure

For the Graduate Certificate in Mental Health Nursing and Allied Health Award Structure, refer to Appendix A.

3.1.1 Compulsory Courses

The Certificate of Mental Health Nursing and Allied Health Award consists of 4 compulsory program courses. Students have to undertake the compulsory courses as outlined in Appendix A.

3.1.5 Specialisations

There are no Specialisations permitted in this Award.

3.1.6 Special Interest Courses

3.5 Alternative Pathways

3.6 Volume of Learning

3.6.1 Standard Duration

- (a) The standard duration for the Graduate Certificate in Mental Health Nursing and Allied Health Award is 0.5 years of equivalent full-time study.
- (b) A student is only able to enrol in this Award on a part-time basis.

3.6.2 Accelerated Duration

An accelerated mode is not available for the Graduate Certificate in Mental Health Nursing and Allied Health Award.

3.6.3 Maximum Duration

The maximum period of time within which a student is permitted to complete the Graduate Certificate in Mental Health Nursing and Allied Health Award is 3 years (including any periods of approved leave of absence) from the date on which they were first enrolled into the program by the University.

3.7 Graduation

Where a student has satisfied all the requirements of the Graduate Certificate in Mental Health Nursing and Allied Health Award as detailed in these Program Regulations and the General Regulations, the University may grant the student graduation status.

3.8 Exit Awards

An Exit Award pathway is not available for this Award.

3.9 Honours

The Graduate Certificate in Acute Mental Health Award is not offered with Honours.
