1 INTRODUCTION AND INTERPRETATION

1.1 Introduction

These Program Regulations apply to all students enrolled in the Bachelor of Outdoor Recreation Award at The University of Notre Dame Australia.

These Regulations should be read in conjunction with the University's General Regulations and the School of Health Sciences Regulations.

1.2 Interpretation

The terms included in these Regulations have the meanings as defined in the University's General Regulations and the School of Health Sciences Regulations.

1.3 Amendments made to Program Regulations

Unless otherwise specified, when amendments are made to the structure, content or academic requirements of the Bachelor of Outdoor Recreation Award, the amendments will automatically apply in accordance with General Regulation Section 1.7.

1.4 Applicability to Campuses of the University

The Bachelor of Outdoor Recreation Award is available on the Fremantle Campus only.

1.5 The Australian Qualifications Framework (AQF)

The Bachelor of Outdoor Recreation Award is a Level 7 AQF qualification.

2 ENTRY CRITERIA

2.1 General Criteria

The standard entry requirements for admission are detailed in the University's General Regulations and the School of Health Sciences Regulations.

2.2 Additional Entry Requirements / Pre-Requisites

The following entry requirements apply to this Award:

An applicant must hold a current Apply First Aid (Senior First Aid Certificate, with CPR) on commencement of the degree.

2.3 External Accreditation Requirements

External accreditation requirements are not applicable to this Award.

3 AWARD REQUIREMENTS

3.1 Structure

For the Bachelor of Outdoor Recreation Award Structure, refer to Appendix A.

3.1.1 Compulsory Courses

3.1.2 Elective Courses

There are Elective course(s) within this Award.

3.1.3 Majors and Double Majors

A Major in Preventive Health is available with the Bachelor of Outdoor Recreation Award. There are no Double Majors available with this Award.

3.1.4 Minors

A Minor in the following subjects are permitted within this Award:

- Counselling
- Preventive Health
- Science

3.1.5 Specialisations

There is an option of a Specialisation in the following subjects within this Award:

- Business
- Preventive Health
- Science
- Exercise Sports Science

3.1.6 Special Interest Courses

There are no Special Interest courses available in this Award.

3.2 Special Award Requirements

Students enrolled in this Award are required to complete the following certifications: Wilderness First Aid, Munda Biddi Ride Guide, Australian Canoeing Awards for basic skills (canoe, kayak, sea kayak) and Aquatic Rescue Qualification (ARQ) (yearly practical) as part of various courses within the Award.

3.3 Practicum or Internship requirements

Students are to complete three Practicums within this Award:

HLTH1506 Outdoor Recreation Industry Practicum 1A (comprising 50 hours)

HLTH1507 Outdoor Recreation Industry Practicum 1B

HLTH2508 Outdoor Recreation Industry Practicum 2A (comprising 100 hours)

HLTH2509 Outdoor Recreation Industry Practicum 2B

HLTH3512 Outdoor Recreation Industry Internship A (comprising 150 hours)

HLTH3513 Outdoor Recreation Industry Internship B

- I. Placements are managed and authorised by the Practicum Coordinator and require students to formally register and seek approval for the placement with the Coordinator prior to commencement.
- II. Students must maintain currency in a water based qualification (Aquatic Rescue Qualification, Surf Bronze or equivalent – Resuscitation /CPR must be included within) to be eligible to enroll into Practicum courses.

3.4 Approved Course substitutions

Course substitutions, where permitted, must be approved by the Dean.

3.5 Alternative Pathways

Alternative Pathways are not applicable for this Award.

3.6 Volume of Learning

3.6.1 Standard Duration

- (a) The standard duration of the Bachelor of Outdoor Recreation Award is three (3.0) years of equivalent full-time study.
- (b) A student is able to enrol in this Award on a part-time basis.

3.6.2 Accelerated Duration

An accelerated mode is not available for the Bachelor of Outdoor Recreation Award.

3.6.3 Maximum Duration

The maximum period of time within which a student is permitted to complete the Bachelor of Outdoor Recreation Award is eight years (including any periods of approved leave of absence) from the date on which they were first enrolled into the Program by the University.

3.7 Graduation

Where a student has satisfied all the requirements of the Bachelor of Outdoor Recreation Award as detailed in these Program Regulations and the General Regulations, the University may grant the student graduation status.

3.8 Exit Awards

An Exit Award pathway is not available for this Award.
