This Document has been designed to assist and support lecturing at the University of Notre Dame Australia. It includes an overview of all Audio visual resources available in the major lecture venues. It outlines how to use the equipment within a particular venue. Please be reminded that each school has laptops and data projectors for portable use in smaller venues. These are administered by the respective school administrative staff.

To supplement this booklet, an A4 copy of the same instructions has been placed within the respective teaching venues. As with all lecturing, staff need to ensure that they have done their own preparation and/or familiarisation with a particular venue and equipment therein. Should an update or run through with the use of a particular venue and its equipment be required, please book a time emailing the IT Service Desk at fremantle.it@nd.edu.au.

The success of the AV and IT reliability relies on staff being conscious that others will be following them into venues. Please do not change settings, remove connections or alter any of the equipment. This can lead to frustration for fellow lecturers and support staff.
