1.1 Introduction

1.2 Interpretation

The terms included in these Regulations have the meanings as defined in the University's General Regulations and the School of Health Sciences Regulations.

1.3 Amendments made to Program Regulations

Unless otherwise specified, when amendments are made to the structure, content or academic requirements of this Award, the amendments will automatically apply in accordance with General Regulation Section 1.7.

1.4 Applicability to Campuses of the University

This Award is available on the Fremantle Campus only.

1.5 The Australian Qualifications Framework (AQF)

The Bachelor of Preventive Health Award is a Level 7 AQF qualification.

2 ENTRY CRITERIA

2.1 General Criteria

The standard entry requirements for admission are detailed in the University's General Regulations and the School of Health Sciences Regulations.

3.1.4 Minors

A Minor in Marketing and a Minor in Behavioural Science are available within the Bachelor of Preventive Health.

3.1.5 Specialisations

There is an option of a Specialisation in the following areas:

- Marketing
- Exercise and Sports Science
- Media and Communication

3.1.6 Special Interest Courses

There are no Special Interest Courses applicable to this Award.

3.2 Special Award Requirements

There are no special award requirements in the Bachelor of Preventive Health.

3.3 Practicum or Internship requirements

Students are to complete three Practicum Courses:

HLTH1504 Preventive Health Industry Practicum 1A and
HLTH1505 Preventive Health Industry Practicum 1B (comprising 50 hours)

HLTH2504 Preventive Health Industry Practicum 2A and
HLTH2505 Preventive Health Industry Practicum 2B (comprising 150 hours)

HLTH3508 Preventive Health Industry Internship A and
HLTH3509 Preventive Health Industry Internship B (comprising 150 hours)

- I. Placements are managed and authorised by the Practicum Coordinator and require students to formally register and seek approval, on the standard form, for the placement with the Coordinator prior to commencement of the placement.
- II. A lower level Practicum Course must be completed prior to enrolment in a higher level Practicum Course unless permission is granted by the Dean.

3.4 Approved Course substitutions

Course substitutions, where permitted, must be approved by the Dean.

3.5 Alternative Pathways

Alternative Pathways are not applicable for this Award.

3.6 Volume of Learning

3.6.1 Standard Duration

- (a) The standard duration of the Bachelor of Preventive Health Award is three (3.0) years of equivalent full-time study.
- (b) A student is able to enrol in this Award on a part-time basis.

3.6.2 Accelerated Duration

- (a) An accelerated mode is not available for the Bachelor of Preventive Health Award.

3.6.3 Maximum Duration

The maximum period of time within which a student is permitted to complete the Bachelor of Preventive Health Award is 8 years (including any periods of approved leave of absence) from the date on which they were first enrolled into the Program by the University.

3.7 Graduation

Where a student has satisfied all the requirements of the Bachelor of Preventive Health Award as detailed in these Program Regulations and the General Regulations, the University may grant the student graduation status.

3.8 Exit Awards

An Exit Award pathway is not available for this Award.
